THE ACTION STORY

This journey of Action Church began over 50 years ago with one woman and one prayer. In rural Alabama, a woman named Nana prayed for one of her sons to become a pastor and bring the life-changing message of Jesus to the multitudes. It turned out her grandson was the answer to that prayer. But, nonetheless, through her faithful prayers the foundation of Action Church was laid.

In January of 2005 a 19 year-old young man was handed an invite card to church. Weeks later this young man decided to attend a church service at Church of the Highlands, in Birmingham, Alabama. It was during this service that this young man rededicated his life to Jesus and discovered the purpose that God had for his life. This young man was Justin Dailey. By 2008, Pastor Justin and Stefanie Dailey were married and packing up a U-haul to move to Bradenton, Florida to begin their first adventure in full-time ministry at Bayside Community Church. Five years after starting a school of ministry, Pastor Justin felt called to start a church.

Pastor Justin always dreamed of a church that would reach people, right where they were, and connect them to everything God has for their life. With the help of an initial A-team of 82 people, who shared this same dream, and the Association of Related Churches (ARC) Action Church began on January 26th, 2014. Close to 800 people attended that first Sunday at Winter Springs High School in Winter Springs, Florida. Since launching Action Church has seen tremendous growth. The life-giving message of the Gospel, the passion and joy of Sunday services, and the relationships built through small groups are all reasons why Action is effectively reaching people. We invite you to see for yourself how exciting church can be when the focus is simple and people are free to seek God with passion.

Nana was just one woman, in one simple, small town, that decided to be faithful and do her part. Her prayers and faith laid the foundation of a lifegiving church that today thousands call home. Imagine what God can do with your obedience, your gifts, and your passions.

KNOW GOD

Sunday Services

We consider reaching people who do not know God personally to be one of our greatest responsibilities, because Jesus came to seek and save that which was lost (Luke 19:10). Our Sunday services are for people at all stages in their spiritual journey but are primarily designed for those who do not yet have a genuine relationship with God.

Our Sunday services focus on four values:

1. Celebration (Fun)

We believe church should be enjoyable.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go into the house of the Lord.'"

2. Inspiration

We believe church should be a place where people experience God's presence.

"But...when some unbelievers or ordinary people come in, they will be convinced of their sin by what they hear. They will be judged by all they hear, their secret thoughts will be brought into the open, and they will bow down and worship God, confessing, Truly God is here among you!"

3. Preparation

We believe church should be a place where people learn how the Bible applies to their daily lives. Sundays need to be applicable to your Monday through Saturday.

"So Christ Himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip His people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up."

4. Salvation

We believe church should be a place where people can accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.' But how can they call on Him to save them unless they believe in Him? And how can they believe in Him if they have never heard about Him? And how can they hear about Him unless someone tells them?"

Found people find people. As we continue to reach people far from God, every one of us has a part to play. These four principles will help us stay focused on the mission:

- 3. Share Your Personal Story
- 4. Give a Personal Invitation

ACTION MISSIONS

In our city, our nation, and our world

1. "In Jerusalem" - Our Cities

The primary way we reach our cities is through our Sunday services, Serve Saturdays, Block Parties and Outreach Small Groups.

2. "In Judea and Samaria" - Our Nation

"As they traveled from town to town, they presented the simple guidelines the Jerusalem apostles and leaders had come up with. That turned out to be most helpful. Day after day the congregations became stronger in faith and larger in size."

The primary way we reach our nation is by starting new churches and strengthening existing churches through the Association of Related Churches (ARC). 3. "To the ends of the earth" - Our World

How you can participate:

1. Pray

3. Go

Go to our cities, nation, and world to serve others and show people the love of God.

FIND FREEDOM

Small Groups

"Day after day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Messiah."

We believe life change happens through relationships. Small Groups have one simple purpose: to bring people together. God created us to live in community with others, and it is only then that we can experience the full life He intends for us.

Small Groups provide three things:

1. A place to connect with others.

"Yes, whatever a person is like, I try to find common ground with him so he will let me tell him about Christ and let Christ save him."

1 CORINTHIANS 9:22 (TLB)

We were not made to do life alone. God created us for community, and Small Groups provide a place for you to connect with others, share life, and grow in faith together.

2. A place to protect each other.

"We know what real love is because Jesus gave up His life for us. So we also ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters."

1 JOHN 3:16 (NLT)

When we do life together, our problems become smaller as God uses others to bring support and encouragement to our lives. Small Groups become a place where others don't just know your name but care about what is happening in your life and want to support you in your spiritual journey.

3. A place to grow together.

We believe every person is created with God-given potential to make a difference in the world. Small Groups are a place you can grow with others to become more like Jesus and reach the potential God has put inside you.

Action Church Small Groups Model

We base our Small Groups model on the early church as described in the Bible in the book of Acts. In Acts, you can read about how small group meetings in homes helped lay the foundation for tremendous growth in the first church in Jerusalem.

"You know that I have not hesitated to preach anything that would be helpful to you but have taught you publicly and from house to house."

Action Church is a church of Small Groups, not a church with Small Groups.

Four things to know about Action Small Groups:

1. Our groups are "free market."

We want people to gather together based on things they enjoy and that are important to them. Essentially, the things you are already doing in your life are the things that can make up your Small Group. From sports groups to lunch groups, parenting groups to student groups, Bible study groups to creative arts groups, our groups are as varied as we are.

2. There are three semesters every year.

Life flows in seasons, and we want to make it easy for you to be in the right Small Group for you in each season. This is why we have new groups that start and stop three times a year in what we refer to as "semesters."



3. Everyone can join a group.

Our hope is for every person at Action to be connected in meaningful community through a Small Group. With so many groups to choose from, we are confident there is a group that is a great fit for you. You can search groups by topic, location, day, and time in our online Small Groups directory at theactionchurch.com/groups. Once you find a few groups that interest you, contact the leaders to learn more and make plans to check them out in person.

4. Anyone can lead a group.

We believe leading a group is simple because we all have something to offer others. Whether it's something you are passionate about, an experience you've had that can help others, or an area in which you are looking to grow, leading a group is a great way to bring people together in meaningful community.

Action Steps

STEP 1 - Become A Member

MAKE A DIFFERENCE

A-Team

All of us were created by God to make a difference in the world around us. God has a place for you where your unique abilities and passions can impact the lives of others. We believe your life will never make sense until you find, develop, and fulfill your purpose.

ACTION CHURCH GOVERNMENT

As you consider investing your heart, time, family, and finances into the life of a church, it is important for you to feel confident in church leadership. Our goal in sharing the details of Action's government is that you will understand that our church is structured to support the values of integrity, accountability, and spiritual authority.

Our church government is made up of three groups of elders:

Guided by Pastors

The Pastoral Staff team is led by Pastor Justin. This team oversees the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church. These staff pastors serve the congregation and are responsible for the development of the spiritual life of the church. The Pastoral Leadership Team serves as Staff Elders.

Protected by Trustees

Our Trustees are three-five members of the congregation appointed by the Lead Pastor to oversee the finances and direct the provision of the facilities needed by the church. They provide counsel to the Lead Pastor regarding the major financial commitments of the church. The Trustees serve as Non-Staff Elders.

Strengthened by Overseers

The Overseers are three-five pastors of respected congregations and ministries who love Action Church and are willing to provide spiritual protection to the church. They may be called upon to help in accountability matters relating to the Senior Pastor if requested to do so by the Pastors or Trustees. The Overseers serve as Apostolic Elders.

CHURCH FINANCES

"Every Sunday each of you make an offering and put it in safekeeping. Be as generous as you can. When I get there you'll have it ready, and I won't have to make a special appeal."

1 CORINTHIANS 16:1-4 (MSG)

At Action Church, we practice tithing for the support of Christ's body, the church, as God commands. We recognize that giving 10% of our income is the Biblical standard for giving.

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it."

MALACHI 3:10 (NIV)

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than Heaven, Hell, or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ-follower, we must also understand what it means to be a giver.

Tithe

The tithe, or "first fruits" of our labor/income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first. You can't say you trust God and not tithe, tithing is the most practical way we show God our trust.

"Be sure to set aside a tenth of all that your fields produce each year."

DEUTERONOMY 14:22-26 (NIV)

Offerings

An offering is giving over and above the tithe. The Bible says that by giving generously, we are able to "take hold of the life that is truly life." You aren't really living unless you are freely giving.

THE GIFT OF GIVING

The gift of giving is a spiritual gift that God gives to some people. It is a Spirit-given capacity and desire to serve God by giving of your material resources, far beyond the tithe, to further the work of God.

Many people love to give to God and as they do, they want to feel confident in the organization through which they give. At Action, we want people to understand they are giving to God through the church, not to the church. As we openly share the honesty, integrity, and spiritual values that guide the financial practices of Action, we believe people can focus on what God is calling them to give and trust that He is leading our church to steward it well.

The giving of tithes and offerings is worship to Jesus and an expression of the relationship between the individual giver and the Lord. That is why we don't have people fill out pledge cards or make faith promises. Funds are not "income only," they are worship and are not considered to be a business transaction but an expression of gratitude toward God.
