On Monday, the Shadow Equalities Minister, <u>Claire Coutinho, met with</u> the <u>Darlington nurses in Parliament</u> and said that equality and diversity policies need revising, not just in the NHS, but in workplaces across the country.

The Darlington nurses have brought a high-profile legal challenge, supported by the Christian Legal Centre, against County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust after being forced to undress and share a changing room with a man.

Following a meeting with Health Secretary Wes Streeting a few weeks ago, the Darlington nurses produced proposals to NHS Trusts on ensuring that changing rooms, showers or toilets may only be shared based on biological sex, not self-declared gender identity.

Please continue to pray that the high-profile nature of this case would help to spread the message that we are all made in God's image, and that he created us male and female (Genesis 1:27). Pray also that women's safe spaces would be better protected.

Justin Welby resignation speech prompts outcry

Yesterday, <u>Justin Welby spoke in the House of Lords about his reasons</u> <u>for resigning</u> as Archbishop of Canterbury.

As <u>Chief Executive Andrea Williams previously wrote</u>, Welby should have resigned long before, due to his persistent departure from the gospel and church teaching.

However, he resigned last month due to fallout from the Church's coverup of child abuse, as exposed by the Makin Report.

Welby's resignation speech in the House of Lords came across as light-hearted, and he was accused of not taking seriously enough the harm done to victims. <u>He apologised</u> earlier today.

Last week, Crystal Palace FC's captain Marc Guéhi was placed under immense pressure to wear an LGBT+ armband to commemorate the Premier League and Stonewall's Rainbow Laces campaign.

He wrote 'I love Jesus' on the armband at the weekend and was promptly reprimanded - but nonetheless chose to write 'Jesus loves you' when he played again on Tuesday evening.

Meanwhile, <u>Muslim footballers have refused to wear gear promoting LGBT ideology</u>, but did not face the same criticism, pressure, and reprimands as those experienced by Marc.

Our Chief Executive <u>Andrea Williams spoke on LBC</u> about the religious discrimination Marc Guéhi is facing, reiterating that he has every right to express his Christian belief that marriage is between one man and one woman.

End of life

GB News interviewed Philip, a former Christian pastor who has been diagnosed with terminal pancreatic cancer and lung cancer, as he spoke against the assisted suicide bill and shared his hope in Christ. The Guardian reports that MP Diane Abbott has warned GPs may start offering assisted suicide as a cheaper alternative to hospice care. The Independent published the hopeful analysis that 'More than 30 MPs who voted in favour of assisted dying could still change their minds' and vote against it at third reading. Give thanks for the increasing public opposition to assisted suicide, and pray that MPs will understand the dangers of this legislation, and vote against it at third reading. Islam

Our Head of Public Policy <u>Tim Dieppe was interviewed on Talk TV</u> to voice concerns about possible Islamic blasphemy laws in the UK, following calls during Prime Minister's Questions to ban the 'desecration of religious texts' including the Qur'an. Tim also took the opportunity to share why Jesus is the only way to God, and why Christianity is the one true religion.

The Daily Mail reports on accusations of antisemitism and bias after the Oxford Union held a 'shambolic' 'fiasco' of a debate which "labelled Israel an 'apartheid state responsible for genocide'".

Meanwhile, the Telegraph revealed that attempts to ban 'Islamophobia' are merely the law catching up with the current reality, as "Britain already has an 'Islamophobia law' – we're just too scared to admit it".

Pray that freedom of speech will be protected, and that there will be increasing awareness about the prevalence of Islamic influence in the UK.

In the first conviction of its kind in Northern Ireland, <u>pro-lifer Claire</u> Brennan was convicted and fined for saying 'The Lord's Prayer' in an <u>abortion clinic censorship zone</u>. She will appeal her conviction, with the support of the Christian Legal Centre.

Christian Concern client Stephen Green, a Christian preacher who held a sign with Psalm 139:13 on it outside an abortion clinic, <u>lost his appeal after being convicted for protesting abortion in a 'buffer zone'.</u>

Please pray that these Christians will both get justice, that the Christian Legal Centre will have wisdom in handling Claire's appeal, and that women will continue to be offered life-saving alternatives and information outside abortion clinics.

The man was convicted of two counts of assault, and a charge of intending to procure a miscarriage.
