Rally against increasingly deadly suicide bill

Kim Leadbeater's private members' bill to legalise assisted suicide is currently going through Parliament. Today, Head of Public Policy <u>Tim Dieppe reflected on the happenings in Parliament</u> from the last week, writing:

"This week's debates in the committee scrutinising Kim Leadbeater's Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill demonstrated just how big an impact on society this bill will have."

The most likely date for its crucial third reading is Friday 25 April. At the third reading, MPs will decide whether the bill will become law.

We need as many people as possible to join us outside Parliament to show MPs how important it is for them to reject this bill.

We need to define sex in law properly

This week, the Sullivan Review, led by Professor Alice Sullivan, recommended separately recording biological sex and gender identity, after finding that UK public bodies have conflated the two in data collection, leading to inaccuracies in healthcare, crime statistics and policy-making.

Christian Concern welcomes these proposals to record sex accurately, but we have been <u>calling for the government to define sex in law</u> for years.

Sadly, a number of our clients, including the <u>Darlington Nurses</u>, <u>Dr David Mackereth</u>, and <u>'Hannah'</u>, all lost their jobs for believing that biological sex is unchangeable - a belief that has been vindicated (once again) by a professional report.

The Sullivan Review said:

"We recommend against using the phrase 'sex assigned at birth'. This phrasing is inaccurate and misleading, as sex is determined at conception and typically observed in utero or at birth..."

Pray that common sense would return to public bodies, pray that the Gender Recognition Act (which allows people to legally change their gender) would be repealed, and pray that our nation would once again recognise that we are uniquely created male or female in the image of God.

Christian academic: ARC conference fell short

Wilberforce Collective Faculty member and Director of the Crosslands Forum Dr Dan Strange wrote for the Gospel Coalition on his reflections about last month's Alliance for Responsible Citizenship (ARC) conference. "Amid all the talk of Judeo-Christian foundations, values, and virtues, largely absent were the name of Jesus Christ, the gospel of grace, and the centrality of the church—except for a few notable moments." "Without Jesus Christ and the gospel of grace, we don't have Christianity, and we don't have the gospel but an anti-gospel." Paul Huxley, our Communications Manager, also previously wrote about our society's need for Jesus - not a Christian-ish veneer - to be central in our nation: "Jesus and his teaching is the only secure foundation for a just, loving, truthful nation. But more than that, Jesus himself needs to be loved and honoured." "Jesus Christ - not religion, not religious freedom, not Christian ideology but Jesus Christ himself - at the heart of society." End of life
After the Royal College of GPs moved its stance on assisted suicide, from being opposed to being neutral, over 250 doctors signed a letter to the Times saying it's "grossly misrepresenting" members and insisting they're not neutral.
Pray that MPs would listen to these GPs' concerns, and that they would vote down the assisted suicide bill that would essentially make doctors killers.
Marriage

The Telegraph reveals that the government is planning to <u>"give unmarried couples the same rights"</u> as married ones, giving "greater protections for those who refuse to tie the knot."

Pray with us that the dignity of marriage - as a God-ordained institution, not simply a piece of paper - would be recognised and valued in the UK.



Islam

Douglas Murray discusses the severe persecution of Christians in Islamist-dominated nations, <u>asking why the West - and especially Western church leaders - are so silent about these atrocities</u>: "So long as Christian leaders in the West ignore the plight of their own churches... many people round the world will continue to way 'well if the church doesn't speak up for it's own, why should we speak up for it?"

Meanwhile BBC's Radio drama *The Archers* has prompted complaints about a storyline where <u>a Christian character celebrates Ramadan</u> while "sidelining Lent, the Christian season of fasting and reflection, which coincides with Ramadan."

Focus on Western Islamism highlights <u>Karandeep Mamman's</u> recent legal win - supported by the Christian Legal Centre, saying it is <u>"a major setback"</u> for those trying to implement an 'Islamophobia' ban.

Pray that, in the midst of the increasing Islamisation of the UK, Christians would be bold and faithful witnesses for Christ and vocal in their support of preserving Christian freedoms. Pray also for strength, safety and freedom for our brothers and sisters facing brutal persecution in Islamic countries.



Gender

The BBC reports on a young man, Joshua McParland, who was in the process seeking gender reassignment surgery, but when he became a Christian, he realised "it was wrong to try to change his gender" and he had simply "been 'running away' from problems in his life."

Give praise for this remarkable testimony of God's life-changing grace, and pray that Joshua's story would increasingly reveal the deception of transgender ideology. And pray for the other man highlighted in the BBC news story, that he too would find Jesus, live in line with how God made him and know God's goodness.

Society

Astronaut Butch Wilmore, finally returned to earth after nine months stuck in space, <u>shared how his faith was a bedrock for him during this time</u>: "God is working out his plan and his purposes for his glory... and however that plays out, I am content because I understand that."

Praise God for Butch's safe return and for his faithful testimony to God's grace and sovereignty in everything. Pray that he adjusts well to life back on earth and that many would be drawn to Christ because of his witness.


