Anti-Christian bias as teacher's trial restarts

The case of Christian teacher 'Hannah' (name changed due to reporting restrictions) <u>had to be stalled after one of the members on the Tribunal</u> presiding over her case was found to have anti-Christian bias.

Hannah was sacked by the primary school she worked at for questioning its 'trans affirming' policy — and her retrial began this week.

But history is almost repeating itself, because her trial was abandoned last year and rescheduled (for this week) after it collapsed when the whole presiding panel was forced to recuse itself for 'apparent bias.'

Her case was covered in the media, including by the BBC, The Telegraph, the Daily Mail, GB News and Nottingham Post.

Please pray for Hannah's case after she gave evidence this week. Pray that she would receive justice after four years of legal battle. Pray also that transgender ideology would not be taught to young children, and that Christians like Hannah would continue to be bold to resist it.

Bernard gets retrial over biased panel member

On the same day as Hannah's case, a <u>judge ruled that Bernard</u> Randall's case needs a <u>fresh tribunal</u> to hear his case, because there was an 'appearance of bias' in the first tribunal.

The 'bias' was found because the same member who sat on the Tribunal for Hannah's case also sat on Bernard's case.

Bernard's extraordinary case, which has been going on for six years now, shocks every person who hears about <u>all the details for the first time</u>.


<u>Our summary of his story so far</u> has gone viral on X (passing a million views) as we explained all the twists and turns that make Bernard's case near-unbelievable.

Blasphemy laws, Ramadan and 40k in opposition

Head of Public Policy Tim Dieppe appeared on the *Premier Unbelievable?* show with Andy Bannister to discuss <u>'Islamophobia' in Britain</u> and what this means for Christians.

Tim also commented in the Daily Sceptic on Ramadan and the growing influence of Islam in the United Kingdom. He writes:

I don't think anyone insulting any other religion or religious leader has been arrested or imprisoned for a very long time."

Our <u>petition calling on the Deputy Prime Minister</u> to reject adopting the APPG definition of 'Islamophobia' has over 40,000 signatures.



End of life

The assisted suicide bill committee continued to meet this week. Kim Leadbeater MP said that, under her bill, <u>doctors would be obliged to offer assisted suicide</u> to all patients with terminal diagnoses. She later denied this implication of her bill, but the confusion continues to demonstrate how poorly thought through this legislation is.

Conservative MP Danny Kruger explained how a series of <u>amendments</u> to make Leadbeater's bill safer have been categorically rejected.

Pray that our culture would never promote death for the most vulnerable in our society. <u>Pray that God would allow Kim Leadbeater's bill to be rejected</u> at third reading.

Gender

New sentencing council guidelines were published on Wednesday that suggest more lenient criminal treatment for people who identify as transgender, or who belong to a faith minority.

Robert Jenrick, the Shadow Justice Secretary, said: "it enshrines antiwhite and anti-Christian bias into our criminal justice system."

In addition, the Times shared that "staff working for NHS Scotland have been told they have a legal duty to <u>treat biologically male colleagues</u> with facial hair as women if they identify as female."

The Darlington nurses - clients of the Christian Legal Centre - were required to do just this, but have taken their NHS trust to court after they were forced to share a changing room with a biological male who openly said that he was trying to get his girlfriend pregnant.

Pray that transgender ideology would come to an end in this nation. Pray that women and children in particular would be kept safe from men who believe they have a right to go into women's spaces.



Society

The Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health (RCPCH) is calling for MPs to back an amendment to the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill that would outlaw smacking in England. In reality, this would not help children who are genuinely being physically abused, but only those whose parents use reasonable chastisement. Pray that this amendment would not be passed and that Christian parents who discipline their children in line with Scripture would not be criminalised. Pray that authorities would be more effective within existing laws to protect children. Read more about the dangers of this bill >> Islam
