

# Tice: AR7 support will not last

Writing in *Energy Voice*, Richard Tice <u>tells</u> renewables developers to "walk away" from AR7. In his first direct message to the sector, he warns the politics of net zero are shifting - and future subsidies can't be guaranteed. He brands AR7 a threat to prices, security, and growth.

### **Energy bills to rise this Autumn**

Cornwall Insight <u>forecasts</u> a 1% rise in the typical annual energy bill from October, bringing it to £1,737. Despite stable wholesale prices, policy-driven costs - like the <u>expanded</u> Warm Home Discount - are pushing bills up.

### Energy is the hidden ingredient in UK food inflation

Food inflation <u>hit</u> 4.9% in July, with prices up 37% over five years. While weather and global shocks get headlines, rising energy costs remain a major but underreported factor.

# Norway strikes major North Sea oil find

Norway has <u>made</u> one of its biggest North Sea oil discoveries in a decade - 134 million barrels - just 100 miles from Shetland. The find, in a region thought to be fully explored, highlights the policy gap with the UK, where new fossil fuel licences have been banned under Ed Miliband.

# **UK North Sea tax slump threatens GB Energy**

Falling windfall tax revenues risk blowing a hole in the Autumn Budget, RSM UK warns. July's North Sea receipts dropped to £770m, well below forecasts, casting doubt on Labour's ability to fund GB Energy as planned.

### Rayner sued over £1bn data centre approval

Angela Rayner faces a legal challenge from green groups after approving a £1bn Al data centre in Buckinghamshire. Activists say the decision bypassed environmental checks and threatens net zero goals, warning of major energy and water demands.

## Californian blackouts blamed on green energy

Rolling blackouts in California are being <u>linked</u> to overdependence on wind and solar, which drop off during peak demand. Critics say shutting reliable gas and nuclear plants has left the grid exposed - forcing the state to restart fossil fuel stations to keep lights on.

#### Supermajors ramp up investment in LNG

Oil majors are <u>betting</u> big on liquified natural gas, throwing down the gauntlet to predictions of peak gas by the end of the decade. Shell, TotalEnergies and Exxon Mobil are all doubling down on LNG investments and betting against the energy transition.
