

Worker 'Protection' Bill hides sneaky free speech implications

The eSafety Commissioner isn't the only threat to free speech. We've spotted another bill which is quietly working through parliament. This is the proposed "[Commonwealth Workplace Protection Orders](#)" (CWPO) Bill that is on its way to the Senate, which whilst well intended, risks being abused by activists unhappy with online criticism.

The recent case of [Kiralie Smith](#) is a stark reminder that these types of orders can be misused to stifle free speech, rather than to protect vulnerable people. We have [proposed amendments](#) would ensure this new Bill can't be used the same way.
