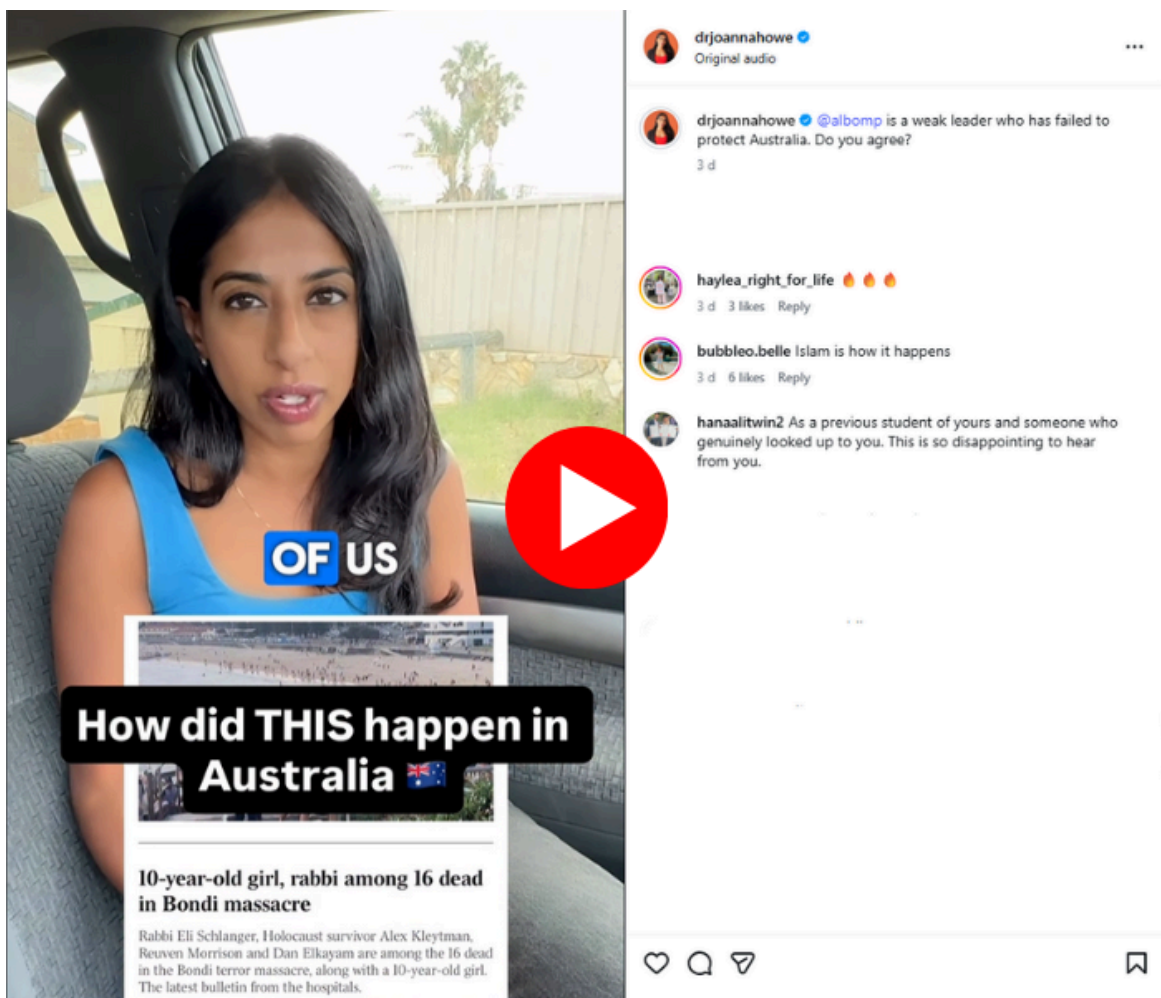


DR JOANNA HOWE

I didn't know whether to speak on social media about what happened in Bondi but in the end, after an in-depth conversation with my husband James, I decided to.



The failure of Prime-Minister Anthony Albanese to protect Australians, from babies in the womb to Jewish people at a Hannukah celebration, must be exposed.

The loss of innocent human life - whether its 15 people in Bondi murdered in a terrorist attack or 88,000 babies murdered in the womb – all of it needs to be addressed.

I think we all intrinsically know that there is something sacred about human life.

Even most vegans who abhor the taking of an animal life would hesitate to call a meat-farmer a mass murderer on par with Stalin.

Together, you and I are fighting for an Australia where every person is valued - from conception until natural death and unless we speak up and fight for this, more innocent lives will be lost.

This week I gave the graduation address at Campion College in Sydney and I spoke to the students about three important principles to live by:

- **Put your family first:** I spoke of the importance of choosing one's spouse wisely and having lots of children.
- **Live an extraordinary life:** I drew on the life of Maximillian Kolbe, a Catholic priest who was martyred in Aushwitz in 1941 so that a married Jewish man could be saved.
- **Fight for the truth:** I identified the battle over the truth as *the* battle of our time and the urgent need for young people to courageously tackle the lies.



This week we were confronted with the devastating reality that a father can train his son toward horrific evil or shape him toward extraordinary good.

Fathers and families shape the moral foundation of the next generation, and we need them to stand up for the plight of vulnerable babies in the womb.

If we want to save our country, we must raise children who courageously pursue truth, goodness and beauty, grounded in the dignity of every human life.
